Dress code: women and girls should wear dresses or skirts and head coverings (veils can be found in the back of the church.) Men should wear dress slacks, suits, and ties. For more information, please refer to the guide for Christian modesty posted at the entrance of the church.

Holy Communion may only be received by Catholics who observe the traditional teachings of the Catholic Church, are in the state of sanctifying grace, and have completed a three hour fast.



Announcements

- **Breakfast Church Fundraiser:** After Mass, all are welcome to stay for breakfast in front of the Church. Please come and join us for great food and conversation.
- **Easter Duty:** The faithful are reminded of their serious obligation to receive Holy Communion at least once during the Easter Time (1st Sunday Lent – Trinity Sunday)
- **Confession:** The faithful are reminded of their serious obligation to go to confession at least once a year. (Precept of the Church)

Fast and Abstinence during Lent

- Those 21 to 59 years of age are bound to fast and abstain according to the laws of Holy Mother the Church during the Lenten Season (excluding Sundays), unless lawfully dispensed.
- On a day of fast, only one full meal is allowed, with two smaller meatless meals, sufficient to maintain one's strength. The two smaller meals together may not equal another full meal.
- The law of fasting binds under pain of serious sin. Those who are ill, convalescent, in delicate health, pregnant or nursing are lawfully excused. Those employed in strenuous manual labor, provided they work a great part of the day, are lawfully excused as well (farmers, millworkers, etc.).

Chief commandments (precepts) of the Church

1. To assist at Mass on all Sundays and holydays of obligation
2. To fast and abstain on the days appointed
3. To confess our sins at least once a year
4. To receive Holy Communion during the Easter time
5. To contribute to the support of the Church
6. To observe the laws of the Church concerning marriage

Additional commandments (precepts) of the Church

- Forbidden to read or possess bad books, magazines, or other publications
- Forbidden to take part or have membership in anti-Catholic associations (Free Masons, secret societies, etc.)
- Forbidden to have the bodies of the deceased cremated
- Ensure the Catholic education of one's children (Catholic school, homeschool, catechism classes, etc.)
